TCNJ Introduces new PAWS system

Primary Academic Web-based Services (PAWS) is The College of New Jersey's new self-service system and will replace The Electronic Student Services (TESS), the Advising, Registration and Transcript Information Exchange (ARTIE), and the Student Information System (SIS). Among other things, you will be able to monitor tuition and financial aid as well as enroll and manage classes and coursework.

Improvements over the current system include faster response time, virtually 24 hour access, online program planners allowing students to run "what if" scenarios to identify courses that would be needed if they changed their majors, and (finally) a back button!

PAWS self-service will be available in 2009. Look for the campus wide announcements or visit http://www.tcnj.edu/~it/csproject/ index.html for more information.
