Marshall P. Smith Scholarship applications are due February 24th at 5:00pm.


Requirements:

TCNJ Psych Students Beyond the Typical Classroom

Many majors are getting involved in the Psychology Department's EL-OPsy courses, giving a broader range of experiences to our students. EL-OPsy courses cover off-campus internships, lab work, honors theses, instructional internships, and independent studies. Just this semester, there are 16 thesis students, 16 instructional interns, and 10 students doing independent studies and research!



Interesting Psychology Fact...

In a study published in early 2009, researchers at Oxford found that playing Tetris within 6 hours of seeing a traumatic film can significantly reduce unwanted flashbacks. The research suggests that visuospatial games soon after a traumatic experience can interrupt memory formation, which has strong significance for issues like Posttraumatic Stress Disorder.
